Proposed Changes to the Charge of the Graduate School of Education Executive Committee Bylaw E4.3, E4.4

PRESENT

E4.3 There shall be a standing graduate advisory committee consisting of Faculty members from each Area Group, the graduate advisor, ex officio, the Dean of the Graduate School of Education ex officio; and, when possible, one graduate student representative selected by the Graduate Student Association of GSOE, without voting rights. The Chair shall have the right to ask for a closed meeting, excluding student member, under certain circumstances, including but not limited to discussions of personnel matters, and of students when student privacy is a concern. The duty of this committee is to advise on the operation of graduate degree programs (M.Ed, M.A., Ph.D.)except the M.Ed. program. (En 25 Jan 72)(Am May 2005). (En Day Month Year)

PRESENT

E4.4.There shall be a standing M.Ed. and Education Minor advisory committee consisting of at least two Faculty members, the Director of Teacher Education who shall be the M.Ed. graduate advisor, ex officio, and the Dean of the Graduate School of Education, ex officio. The duty of this committee is to advise on the operation of the M.Ed graduate degree program.(En May 5, 2005)

PROPOSED

E4.3 There shall be a standing graduate advisory committee consisting of Faculty members from each Area Group, the graduate advisor, ex officio, the Dean of the Graduate School of Education ex officio; and, when possible, one graduate student representative selected by the Graduate Student Association of GSOE, without voting rights. The Chair shall have the right to ask for a closed meeting, excluding student member, under certain circumstances, including but not limited to discussions of personnel matters, and of students when student privacy is a concern. PROPOSED

E4.4. There shall be a standing <u>Undergraduate Education Committee. The</u> <u>members of this committee will consist of a</u> <u>Chair and a minimum of four members of the</u> <u>GSOE. This may include ex-officio members,</u> <u>e.g., non-ladder faculty members regularly</u> <u>teaching courses in the Undergraduate</u> <u>Education program or members of the</u> <u>committee from the Teacher Education</u> <u>program. The duty of this committee is to</u> <u>advise on the operation of all programs that</u> <u>pertain to undergraduate education. (En May</u> 5, 2005) (<u>En Day Month Year)</u>

Statement of Purpose and Effect:

These changes to the bylaws allow for limited student participation on certain GSOE Committees. They define the scope, time, and means for student participation. They also specify that, as much as possible, each of the Area Groups in the GSOE be represented on some committees so as to ensure fairness and equal representation. Regarding Area Groups, note that the GSOE is one unit, similar to a department of the whole. We break the unit into disciplinary subunits or Area Groups, as follows: Education, Society and Culture; Higher Education Administration and Policy; Educational Policy Analysis and Leadership; Learning and Behavioral Sciences (Formerly: Education Psychology, Special Education and School Psychology). Appropriate representatives of Area groups are Senate faculty.
