On behalf of Graduate Division and the Office of the Registrar, we are respectfully requesting the UCR Academic Senate consider approving the addition of Designated Emphasis on graduate diplomas.

Completion of a designated emphasis would be noted as: "Having Demonstrated Ability by Original Research in X with a Designated Emphasis in Y," where X is the Ph.D. program and Y is the designated emphasis.

If the student also has a concentration, the diploma will reflect the following: "Having Demonstrated Ability by Original Research in X (Y) with a Designated Emphasis in Z," where X is the Ph.D. program, Y is the concentration and Z is the designated emphasis. Attached to this memo is an example of a current Ph.D. diploma for reference.

The addition of Designated Emphasis was approved for UC Berkeley in 2007; therefore, this request requires UCR Academic Senate approval but does not require further approval from the Office of the President.

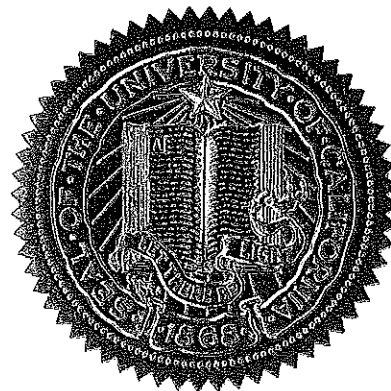
