Dear Dylan,

The tradition and practice of naming student residential buildings at UCR is long standing dating back to 1959 with the opening of its first residence hall. Aberdeen-Inverness was named in honor of two coastal cities located in Scotland. This continued in 2018 with construction and naming of the Dundee Residence Hall and Glasgow Dining Project. The naming of student residential buildings that take after cities and locations in Scotland, has been led by students living on campus, including the: Residence Hall Association, Campus Apartment Resident Association and National Residence Hall Honorary.

While these practices and traditions are an important part of University history, the Chancellor is establishing an ad-hoc committee to consider a more contemporary approach to the naming of buildings and associated outdoor spaces. This committee will be comprised of students, faculty and staff and charged with the task of naming buildings and outdoor spaces within the North District.

By way of this letter, I am requesting nominations from the Committee on Committees for 2 faculty members to serve as Academic Senate representatives on this committee. It is anticipated that the committee will work through Winter quarter of 2020 with recommendations provided to the Chancellor no later than Spring quarter 2020.
