Dear Ahmet,

On December 8, 2025, the Riverside Academic Senate Executive Council discussed the subject proposed revisions to systemwide Senate bylaw 140 and had no comments to add to those from local committees (attached).

I call your attention to the following comments from local committees:

The faculty executive committee of the College of Humanities, Arts, and Social Sciences: (CHASS): The CHASS Executive Committee reviewed the proposed revisions and noted that the revisions fundamentally change the nature of the work done on the committee, so perhaps a renaming would be appropriate. The committee also noted it would be valuable to clearly articulate what forms of response or corrective actions are expected to be enacted once inequities are identified/documented, in order to avoid reporting fatigue often encountered across the system. A clear guidance on best practices or recommended actions to take would be helpful. The committee also discussed and asked questions regarding timeliness, how often would the committee be providing feedback to the University and how often would it be conferring/reporting, as well as to whom?

The faculty executive committee of the College of Natural and Agricultural Sciences (CNAS): The committee has expressed concerns with pre-emptively removing diversity language from the bylaws and do not agree with these actions that seem to characterize diversity as a negative component of university proceedings. The consensus is that diversity is in the best interest of the university and should remain an integral part of our policies and practices.

The Graduate Council: While the Council is philosophically opposed to these revisions, the Council approved of them.

The Committee on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (CODEI): ... reviewed the above proposal and notes a few key points of concern. Generally, the proposed revisions seek to modernize the naming

of the University Committee on Affirmative Action, Diversity, and Equity (UCAADE) to reflect the current duties and role of the committee. With these changes, however, the committee urges systemwide to retain 'Diversity' in its name as an identifier of an integral part of the role of the committee and the mission of the University of California. In addition to potentially limiting the scope of the committee, and as a legally permissive description of the committee, removing this language may give an impression of noncompliance and invite further scrutiny from malicious external entities. Separately, in renaming the current UCAADE committee, the concept of 'accountability' needs to be well defined with clear maintenance of and links to measurable indicators for assessment 'accountability' at the committee level.
