To be awarded a graduate degree, graduate students may meet graduation requirements in the UCR catalog either: (1) in effect at the time of entrance to UCR, or (2) petition the Vice Provost and Dean of Graduate Studies to use those subsequently established after entrance and prior to the student's

graduation.

This update was coordinated between the Registrar's Office, Undergraduate Colleges, and the Graduate Division.

The current policy for undergraduates has historically created challenges with interpretation based on the reliance on enrollment. The Colleges/School's Advising are supportive of a policy that is more definitive in its definition, while maintaining the need to provide support for transfer students. An exception, if needed, can be made but it is felt that the majority of students can be served with the above language.

The previous regulation only referenced undergraduate students, with no mention of graduate students. This update adds clear information for graduate student catalog year expectations and matches what Graduate Division is enforcing now.
