

Re: 19-20. CR. Resubmission-UCR Online Course Agreement ILTI Agreement

The Committee on Academic Freedom considered the document "19-20. CR. Resubmission-UCR Online Course Agreement ILTI Agreement" submitted for a campus review on February 19, 2020.

Previously, the Committee on Academic Freedom considered the proposed UCR Online Course Agreement (ILTI Agreement) submitted for Systemwide Review on October 3, 2019, and submitted its response on November 5, 2019. However, the initial set of documents missed the key document "2019 Draft UCR on-line course license agreement", while containing some outdated materials instead. These omissions were the cause of criticisms included in our original response. In particular, it was not clear which party owns the copyright to the on-line course and how the ownership is divided or transferred. The new submitted draft of the license agreement eliminates these concerns. The Committee opines that the proposed license proposal is acceptable, at least as far as Academic Freedom is concerned. The Committee does not have sufficient expertise to comment on other, more legalistic, aspects of this document.
