With this, R&J believes the proposed regulations would benefit from modest modifications to increase clarity and consistency. The punctuation of the lists of departments for the three election cycles are all different and somewhat confusing. The punctuation should be consistent across groups, as well as conforming to the style guide set by the registrar (https://registrar.ucr.edu/crs/style#commas).

Suggestion:

4.1.1.1 The five members of the Executive Committee from the departments of Chemistry; Evolution, Ecology and Organismal Biology; Molecular, Cell and Systems Biology; Nematology; and Environmental Sciences are elected in the same year. The four members of the Executive Committee from the departments of Earth and Planetary Sciences; Physics and Astronomy; Microbiology and Plant Pathology; and Statistics are elected in the same year. The four members of the Executive Committee from the departments of Biochemistry; Botany and Plant Sciences; Entomology; and Mathematics are elected in the same year.
